#### **COUNTY DEED**

(STATUTORY FORM - SECTION 125.411, Florida Statutes)

**THIS DEED**, made this 6th day of May 2025, between Brevard County, a political subdivision of the State of Florida, whose address is 2725 Judge Fran Jamieson Way, Viera, Florida, 32940, party of the first part, and Disabled American Veterans Titusville Chapter #109, Inc., whose address is 435 North Singleton Avenue, Titusville, Florida 32796, party of the second part,

(Whenever used herein the terms "party of the first part" and "party of the second part" include all the parties to this instrument and their heirs, legal representatives, successors, and assigns. "Party of the first part" and "party of the second part" are used for singular and plural, as the context requires, and the use of any gender shall include all genders.)

WITNESSETH that the said party of the first part, for and in consideration of the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00), to it in hand paid by the party of the second part, receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained and sold to the party of the second part, its successors and assigns forever, the following described land situate, lying and being in Brevard County, Florida to wit:

In the event the subject property is at any time vacated or abandoned, or, in the event said property is not utilized to provide nonprofit services for disabled American veterans or other public purpose, then in that event, all right, title and interest of the party of the second part, Disabled Americans Veterans Titusville Chapter #109, its successors and assigns, in and to the subject property shall immediately revert and revest in Brevard County, Florida by operation of law.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BREVARD COUNTY, FLORIDA, PURSUANT TO SECTION 125.38, FLORIDA STATUTES, AND SECTION 2-247, BREVARD COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES, AUTHORIZING CONVEYANCE OF COUNTY PROPERTY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

**WHEREAS**, Brevard County, Florida, a political subdivision of the State of Florida (hereinafter the COUNTY) owns a certain parcel of land as described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, the Disabled American Veterans Titusville Chapter #109, Inc. (DAV) owns the adjacent parcel to the north of the COUNTY parcel; and

WHEREAS, DAV is a nonprofit organization dedicated to serving veterans in the community by providing services including, but not limited to, benefits assistance, food pantry, transportation for medical care and community care appointments, and ministerial services; and

WHEREAS, due to a significant demand for services, DAV is seeking additional property for office space in order to better serve its clients; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY parcel being adjacent to their existing location makes a particularly suitable location for the expansion of its operation, and

WHEREAS, DAV has applied for a donation conveyance of the COUNTY owned parcel described in Exhibit "A", which it intends to use to continue providing nonprofit services to disabled American veterans, which will serve the public interest and the welfare of the community; and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY finds that the DAV's proposed use of the property for the expansion of its operations will serve a public purpose, promote the public health, safety, and welfare, and serve the public interest, and the COUNTY has determined that said parcel is not needed for COUNTY purposes, such that conveying the parcel to DAV will be in the best interest of the COUNTY.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Board of County Commissioners of Brevard County, Florida, that:

- 1. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporated as part of this Resolution by this reference.
- The COUNTY parcel, as more fully described in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated by this reference, is not needed for COUNTY purposes.
- 3. The COUNTY authorizes the conveyance of the COUNTY parcel to DAV to be used for the public purpose of expanding its operations of providing nonprofit veterans' services to the community.

- 4. In the event the COUNTY parcel is not used or ceases to be used and maintained for a veterans services operations center, the COUNTY retains a possibility of reverter interest with the right to reenter and repossess the property.
- 5. The COUNTY authorizes the Chair, Board of County Commissioners, to execute all necessary documents to convey the COUNTY parcel as described in Exhibit "A" to the DAV by County Deed for nominal consideration pursuant to Section 2-247, Brevard County Code of Ordinances.
- 6. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

Dear Mr. Denninghoff,

On behalf of Disabled Americans Veterans Titusville Chapter #109, INC., we respectfully request Brevard County's consideration to donate the above-referenced County-owned parcel to our nonprofit organization under the provisions of F.S. 273.055(3)(b). We understand that Brevard County has previously donated property in the City of Titusville to nonprofit agencies under similar circumstances, and we hope our request aligns with that precedent.

As a nonprofit organization dedicated to serving disabled veterans in our community, the demand for our services has grown significantly. This increased need has prompted us to seek additional office space to better accommodate and serve our clients. The parcel in question (Tax Account # 2108124) is directly adjacent to our existing location, making it a perfect fit to expand our operations.

Please find attached a letter of support from the Titusville City Council, whose members voted unanimously to authorize the Mayor to submit this correspondence to the County.

Below is a summary of the critical services we provide to disabled veterans and their families:

- 1. **Service Assistance**: Our Service Officers assist veterans and their dependents in obtaining the benefits they have earned, operating six days a week.
- 2. Food Pantry: Available six days a week to provide food to veterans and their families.
- 3. **Transportation Network**: We offer door-to-door service for veterans attending VA medical appointments, C&P exams, and community care appointments—the only program of its kind in Brevard County.
- 4. Veterans Lunch Program: Free lunches are provided to veterans five days a week.
- 5. **Guitars for Veterans**: We teach veterans with PTSD to play guitar. Upon completion of the program, participants are given a guitar and accessories.
- 6. Community Support for Veterans' Families: Our hall is available at no charge for memorial services and wakes for veterans' families.
- 7. **Ministerial Services**: We provide ordained ministers for graveside services at the National Cemetery.

- 8. **Veterans Appreciation Events**: Monthly cookouts bring together veterans and community members.
- 9. **Support for VA Medical Centers**: We donate toiletries, socks, undergarments, and other essentials to VA medical centers from Orlando to Fort Lauderdale.

All these services are offered free of charge and delivered by a dedicated team of volunteers. By providing these critical programs, we reduce the demands placed on the County's own Veterans Affairs Office, ensuring that veterans in Brevard County receive the support they need.

We sincerely appreciate your consideration of this request, which would enable us to continue and expand our vital mission of serving those who have served us.
