There is also a <u>Public Art Review Board</u> that reviews requests from artists to place their work in County buildings.

 - Yes. <u>Chapter 62</u> of the Volusia County Code of Ordinances establishes a historic preservation element in Volusia, which includes the <u>County</u> <u>Historic Preservation Board.</u>
- Osceola County
 - Nothing found in the Osceola County Code of Ordinances, but the <u>Board</u> helps fund the Osceola County Historical Society (501(c)(3) organization) and also partners with the Historical Society on certain projects.
- Orange County
 - Nothing found in the Orange County Code of Ordinances, but the <u>Board</u> has an agreement with the Historical Society of Central Florida to manage historical artifacts.
- Indian River County
 - Nothing similar found.
- Seminole County
 - Yes. <u>Chapter 100</u> of the Seminole County Code of Ordinances establishes the Seminole County Historical Commission.

Marine Advisory Council (or similar)

- Brevard County
 - Yes. Brevard County Marine Advisory Council was established by Resolution 99-258 and Resolution 01-216. The Advisory Council shall serve as technical advisor to the Parks and Recreation Director ... to conduct studies of local marine conditions and needs and to keep

informed as to development in the marine field.. to develop program of activities and services to meet needs/desires of residents and visitors Resolution 01-216 states the Council is established "to advise the Board on issues relating to marine and boating related matters, boating improvement projects, enhanced marine safety and education projects, and waterway improvements; and that the Council shall be supported by the Brevard County Parks and Recreation Department... Mission Statement: The Brevard County Marine Advisory Council provides advice and guidance to the Board of County Commissioners. The scope of work includes all marine related issues to insure a well-maintained, safe, healthy, and friendly marine environment for the residents end visiting user of our marine resources...."

- Volusia County
 - Nothing similar found.
- Osceola County
 - o Nothing similar found.
- Orange County
 - Yes. Orange County has a Parks and Recreation Advisory Board which considers the present and future needs of the park system, including possible expansions or major capital improvements, and shall recommend definite park programs to the Board of County Commissioners; however, there is no specific mention of specific marine and boating matters. The initial resolution creating the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board was adopted on September 18, 1973; a later resolution #91-M-34 was adopted on July 8, 1991. Resolution No. 2006-M-26 was adopted on April 11, 2006, adding two members and changing the requirement for the senior representative. Resolution No. 2012-M-10 was adopted on May 8, 2012.
- Indian River County
 - Nothing similar found.
- Seminole County
 - Somewhat similar. Seminole County has a <u>Parks and Preservation</u> <u>Advisory Committee</u>; however it doesn't specifically mention marine and boating matters. The committee is listed on the Seminole County website, but information regarding the committee was not found in the Seminole County Code of Ordinances.

D2 Canal Dredging (or similar)

- Brevard County
 - Yes. Brevard County's District 2 Dredging Committee provides advice/guidance to the BOC County Commissioners regarding the longand short-term processes of identification, prioritization and scheduling of canal and channel dredging projects in District 2. The District 2 Canal Dredging Committee was established by Resolution 95-103 on April 4, 1995 and has been amended by Resolution 06-13, 08-324 and 13-070.

- Osceola County
 - Nothing similar found.
- Orange County
 - Yes. Orange County has an Advisory Committee for Pumping and Dredging Control. See Orange County Code, Chapter. 15, Art. VI, Sec. 15-216 and Sec. 15-224. Orange County also has a Butler Chain of Lakes Advisory Board for the lakes in the Windermere Water Navigation Control District (WWNCD). WWNCD is the largest lake MSTU in Orange County, including 27 lakes having a combined surface water area over 6,000 acres. The Butler Chain of Lakes has a total of 32 navigable canals. The Butler Chain of Lakes Advisory Board advises Orange County on boating regulations, waterfront construction, canal maintenance, flood plain alterations, etc. the WWNCD regulates dredging, pumping of sand... creating canals, basins, inlets or bays The WWNCD Advisory Board was created on August 2, 1963 by the Florida Legislature and was renamed the Butler Chain of Lakes Advisory Board on March 21, 2006. Orange County also has an advisory board for its Lake Conway Water and Navigation Control District, Orange County Code, Chapter.33, Art II, Sec. 33-26 and Sec. 33-48.
